



## **“Berwick Sound, Waite and Sea”/ StrongBack Productions wins Heritage Lottery Fund support**

Today, StrongBack Productions has received £49,800.00 from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) for an exciting project, Berwick Sound, Waite and Sea, in Berwick-upon-Tweed. The project, led by StrongBack Productions and working with volunteers and project leaders from the local community, focuses on rediscovering the rich music heritage of Berwick’s oral music traditions, The King’s Own Scottish Borderers (KSOB) Music Archive and the historic roles of the Town Waites with a view to reinstating these roles.

The project will enable a wide range of people from Berwick to discover the songs and music from fishing and farming traditions alongside research into the processional music of the King’s Own Scottish Borderers regiment and the music played by the Town Waites. There will be opportunities for volunteers to be trained by Berwick archivist Linda Bankier who will lead workshops in oral history, interviewing, research and cataloguing. Further opportunities to learn and to play the music that has been discovered by the volunteers will be offered through workshops led by some of Berwick’s own musicians in their role as Project leaders. Finally, all of the music unearthed through the project will be performed by Berwick’s music groups in a celebratory festival on October 3<sup>rd</sup> to be held in Berwick-upon-Tweed as a part of the Berwick 900 celebrations.

As an organisation that works with communities across a range of forms to bring into focus aspects of the community’s rich heritage that have remained unexplored, StrongBack Productions is looking forward to helping the community of Berwick, from schools to local businesses, gain a deeper insight into the previously under-researched parts of their history, such as Berwick-upon-Tweed being one of the last boroughs in England to do away with the position of the Town Waites. These were musicians employed by the Corporation to accompany the town dignitaries with music as they attended official civic functions.

Commenting on the award, Dominique Le Gendre, co-artistic Director of StrongBack Productions who has been researching and developing the project in Berwick for over four years said: *“We are thrilled to have received the support of the Heritage Lottery Fund and are confident the project will support an enthusiastic volunteer participation in the re-discovery, learning and celebration of so many aspects of Berwick’s rich musical heritage..”*
